VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

The Heart of America Humane Society (HAHS) is a 100 percent volunteer organization dedicated to finding good, forever homes for animals (cats and dogs) abandoned at two area animal shelters. We work with the Lee's Summit Animal Shelter in Lee's Summit, Mo. and the B.Martin Peck Animal Shelter in Ottawa, Ks.

Heart of America Humane Society has been rescuing dogs and cats for over 15 years. Our volunteers are very proud of the fact that without their help, many of these animals would not have lived to see another day. Since 2001, they have contributed to saving over 8000 lives.

To accomplish our goals, we hold weekly adoptions at three locations in the area. To staff these locations, we are in need of handlers to hold and show the dogs and cats at these adoption events.

We require a short training session prior to handling the animals. These training sessions are held on Saturday, prior to the adoptions and need to be scheduled in advance. We are unable to accept any new volunteers under the age of 14. Volunteers between the ages of 14 thru 17 must have a responsible adult with them at all times.

Volunteers are asked to come 30 minutes before adoptions and stay 30 minutes after to help set up and take down the adoption equipment.

There are many other opportunities to help from time to time and we rely heavily on our volunteers to fill these needs.
